- Digital Citizenship Presentation by Jennifer Davis, Internet Safety Coordinator
 - o There are many steps to get to the Digital Citizenship
 - Inform students, inform parents and inform the community about the bill that talks about digital safety
 - It talks about what is blocked at school and how we can promote safety on the internet
 - $\circ\quad \mbox{We are going to put some information on the PTA website}$
 - District filtering: teachers can use accounts and access youtube etc. They are expected to use SafeShare which allows teachers to watch a video without ads and pop ups.
 - MDM is a system that allows the field tech to put apps on the iPad so that the students don't get into anything that they shouldn't
 - Chromebooks are also filtered to block certain websites and they log in with their school username
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 - When schools get a new iPad, apps are put on for the students by the district and students can't access the app store.
 - When problems arise are they accidental? Teachers can access history to monitor.
 - We have a Digital Citizenship- Jennifer Davis is our representative at Canyon View
 - We have a week in February Internet Safety Week

- Update on Safety Plan at Canyon View
 - Exterior Security Cameras Requested
 - Kiersin gave us an update. There are no exterior safety cameras but she has requested them from the district. We are requesting 6 new cameras. Next a contractor will come to help decide where the cameras should be placed. We want the playground, parking lot and the front of the building covered.
 - We do have cameras inside but not everywhere, just in the interior near main entryways

 O We are just waiting to hear the response from the district level. We are hoping it is going to happen this year but it could happen next year.

 - Discussion on student entry procedure in the morning
 - We have four entry doors that the students use in the back of the building. There is a 15 minute window when the doors are not locked. This is a security breach since that means that anyone can come in during that time.
 - We need some input about this.
 - Is there an option to just make the window 5 minutes instead?
 - It is still a security breach because the doors remained unlocked.
 - One idea is just to allow students enter through the front after the first bell and then after the tardy bell rings, the students will have to get a pass in the office
 - Maybe some volunteers would be ok to check the back areas?
 - o It sounds best to just keep the door locked
