Principal's Message - November 2016

Canyon View Families,

We hope you have enjoyed the first part of the school year. Our first term is coming to an end and Report Cards will be sent home on November 28th. Our students are learning a lot and enjoying using the technology in their classes to enrich their learning experiences.

I wanted to personally invite all of you to our winter music concert that will be held on December 13th at 7:00 p.m. at Butler Middle School. We will have both choir and orchestra performing. This is the concert that parents are invited to, so please come if you can.

As a reminder, with the cold weather and snow, we will only keep students in from recess if it's below 22 degrees, if the air quality is above 90 on the particulate matter scale or if precipitation is such that students will get soaked if they go outside. I understand that parents send their kids dressed to play in all kinds of weather and the teachers would certainly love it if all students stayed out during the entire recess, but for safety concerns I hope you can appreciate the days we keep them in side. Thanks to Marianne Zenger, one of our moms at Canyon View, we hopefully are on track to get our own garden started come springtime. It's really exciting!! Read below all about it from Marianne and how you may be able to be involved.

Have you heard our great garden news? Canyon View Elementary will be growing a garden next year! My son, Eli, is in Mrs. Gunter's 1st grade class and I have 3 more boys heading to Canyon View in the next 6 years and I knew I needed to contribute to the school in some form or fashion. I decided to use my degree and background in Horticulture and proposed to Principal Weller and teachers, the idea of creating a garden space that would allow the teachers and staff to help the students' minds grow in new ways. The staff was fully supportive and enthusiastic and the district approved of our moving forward with the planning so here we go!

School gardens are a great resource for educating children in science and nutrition but have you considered their benefit in all the other ways they help as well? Gardens help teach history, language, math, chemistry, art, economics, geography, weather, journaling, literacy, family and consumer science and best of all, the joy of getting your hands in the soil and seeing the fruits of your labor. The possibilities are endless and exciting. School gardens have been shown to improve eating habits, improve test scores, fight childhood obesity, promote physical activity, connect children to the environment and help change attitudes towards learning. A fantastic opportunity to let little minds grow and grow.

There is still a lot to be done to get our garden started and the need for assistance is paramount. Our garden committee consists of parents, teachers, and school administrators and we are looking for more help. Some of the work will be done by Canyon View families and community members while some work will be done by licensed and insured contractors who will be putting in the cement mow strip, putting up fencing and also changing out the sprinklers to drip irrigation. This month we asked our 5th graders to submit something following a Thanksgiving theme and we received some great drawings. Thank you for your submissions!














TEACHER AND STAFF APPRECIATION


California to see Utah beat UCLA at the Rose Bowl.


