What a GREAT start to the new school year. It has been exciting to see the excitement and enthusiasm of our students and teachers as they have been developing and strengthening classroom relationships and building confidence as they review academic concepts and delve into their new grade level curriculum.

I hope you have felt informed and communicated with regarding changes and improvements happening here at Canyon View. I will send a weekly e-mail informing you of upcoming events and important information. I've also asked my teachers to communicate with you weekly or at least three times a month of what is happening in their classes. We know it takes a village to raise a child and they are most likely to be successful when those supporting them communicate frequently and effectively. We are also continuing to provide reading and math interventions for students by hiring aides through our Land Trust funds which was approved by the school community council. The intervention support also helps teachers provide enrichment opportunities for students.

The parking lot has been running smoother and I'm pleased to let you know that on average we are getting all cars through in about eight minutes which is about three minutes faster than last year. I know, three minutes might not seem like a long time, but when you are sitting there waiting, it can feel like three years. So, good job and thank you for your support and following our parking lot rules. Woot Woot! Final work is still being finished on the fence and hopefully by the time you read this, the basketball standards will have been installed. I've been told any day. We have some extra curricular activities starting and will keep you informed of new ones as they get set up and started. Want to be a VOLUNTEER at Canyon View?


