Academic Goals

Analysis Summary

87% of students are at benchmark for reading composite scores as of winter benchmark and 72% of students are making typical or better growth. Since so many students are on or above benchmark goals we want to focus on academic growth by concept and standard. We feel that focusing on both Acadience and IReady will give is a more accurate picture of overall growth of all students in our school.

Goal

80% of all students will be on benchmark in reading as measured by Acadience Reading Composite scores

- * for those students who start above benchmark in Acadience Reading Composite 80% will show typical growth on iReady reading diagnostic.
- * For students who start on or below benchmark in Acadience Reading Composite 80% will show typical or better progress on Pathways of Progress.

Action Plan Summary

- 1. Increase and support teacher expertise through ongoing professional Learning, team collaboration/planning, data analysis and peer observations (TSSP \$5000 for subs; TSSP \$3000 for admission/registration for professional training). Implement professional learning with one of the following: coaching cycles, lesson studies, and/or walkthrough protocols.
- 2. Focus on WISR (Writing, Inquiry, Speaking & Listening, Reading & Viewing). This year we focus on "W" writing. We will determine a consistent formal process for teaching writing throughout all grades
- 3. Lower student to teacher ratio and increase teacher access and interaction with students by hiring a .5 FTE teacher in 4th grade (Land Trust \$49,000).
- 4. Use i-Ready Math and Reading digital learning platform to support academic progress (TSSP \$6800). Focus on lessons passed per week in each grade level (number of lessons is determined by each grade level). Add time regularly in PLCs to analyze i-Ready data, Participate in i-Ready professional learning (ensure i-Ready professional learning is relevant to all levels of learners)
- 5. Hire ESPs to provide tier 2 instruction to focus on intervention and extension for student reading skills (Land Trust 2 people \$19818; TSSP 3 aides \$34,072)
- 6. Purchase necessary materials needed (such as consumables, training materials, manipulatives, or additional supplementary software) for the ELA curriculum, WISR instruction, and tier II intervention supports (TSSP \$3,000).

Measurement

Acadience reading composite scores and pathways of progress (3 times per year). IReady progress monitoring data (3 times per year).

We will strategically use progress monitoring data from both Acadience and IReady to intensify instruction in tier 1 as well as creating appropriate tier 2 groupings.

We will be focusing on the WISR framework and making it consistent throughout grades to intensify language learning for our Multi Lingual Learners.

Approximately 58% of our office referrals are for physically aggressive behaviors. We believe we can positively influence this behavior by helping students master coping skills as taught through Thrive Time, Zones of Regulation, and Botvin as well as during morning meetings, small groups, increased adult supervision and support.

- 4. Provide additional intervention and support in whole group, small group, and individual instruction for social behavioral instruction and support by paying .3 FTE to make our social worker .8 FTE (TSSP \$26,000)
